

WELCOME TO THE PARISH MASS FOR EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The collect for today asks God that the "course of the world may be directed by your peaceful rule". It goes on to ask God that the Church might "rejoice, untroubled in her devotion". Many people that I talk to, or when I have listened to interviews with atheists and agnostics, point to the state of the world as evidence of God's non-existence. God, it would seem to them, should be some kind of supernatural governor.

As Lent is approaching, perhaps we need to hear that with penitent hearts. Perhaps as the Church we've used words about Christ's reign as King of the Universe in ways that made it sound like He is organising everything here and now. Of course we pray that there would be peace in the world - but as Christianity is, in my view, the most realistic and practical of all beliefs, we are under no illusion about the actual state of the world! It is a mess, and that is the honest truth. Our proclamation is that Christ is coming - He is forever in this world the One Who Is, Was, and Is To Come. We rest in the truth that He has overcome the world, and yet we are still in the midst of the struggle of this world, working out our salvation, knowing that it is God working in us (see Philippians 2:12-13). Let us pray then in this collect today, that our hearts would be made peaceful so as to more closely follow God's direction and that our devotion and faith this Lent would be deepened. Fr lan

REVISION OF CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL

What is the Electoral Roll?

It is your parish church's register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral Roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections and referenda, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on Church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the Parochial Church Council.

Being on the Electoral Roll does NOT make you a "member" of the Church; simply regarding All Saints as your spiritual home does that.

Brothers and Sisters:

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
