# WELCOME TO THE PARISH MASS FOR THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Every celebration of the Holy Eucharist is a thanksgiving celebration.

In fact, Eucharist simply means "thanksgiving" in Greek. We offer thanks to God for all He has done for us, and especially in redeeming the world by the precious death of His Son, Jesus Christ. As Christians, everything that we give thanks for is mediated by the once for all self offering that Christ makes for us on the Cross. This Sunday we give particular thanks for the gifts of the fruits of the earth. We are continually blessed with the bountiful produce of the land and the sea in this country, and it is right that we should remember that it is God who is the giver of all good gifts.

It is fitting that we do this in the context of the Eucharist. After the altar has been prepared by the deacon, the priest offers up the bread to God saying "Blessed are you Lord God of all creation, for through Your goodness we have this bread to offer you, fruit of the earth and work of human hands. It will become for us the Bread of Life." At the offering of the wine, he says: "Blessed are you, lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink."

## Gospel - Mark 6.25-33

"Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?

Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing?

Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?

Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

## Second Reading - The First Letter of St Paul to Timothy 2.1-7

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man[a] Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.

For this I was appointed a preacher and an apostle (I am telling the truth, I am not lying), a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth.
